

## **FUTURISM**

Futurism was an artistic and social movement that originated in Italy in the early 20th century. It emphasized speed, technology, youth, and violence, and objects such as the car, the airplane, and the industrial city.



Dada or Dadaism was an art movement of the European avant-garde in the early 20th century, with early centers in Zürich, Switzerland, at the Cabaret Voltaire: New York Dada began circa 1915, and after 1920 Dada flourished in Paris

# CONSTRUCTIVISM

Constructivism was an artistic and architectural philosophy that originated in Russia beginning in 1913 by Vladimir Tatlin, This was a ejection of the idea of autonomous art. He wanted 'to construct' art. The movement was in favour of art as a practice for social purposes.

## **ART DECO**

Art Deco, sometimes referred to as Deco, is a style of visual arts, architecture and design that first appeared in France just before World War I.[1] Art Deco influenced the design of buildings, furniture, iewelry, fashion, cars, movie theatres, trains, ocean liners, and everyday objects such as radios and vacuum cleaners.

## **POP ART**

Pop art is an art movement that emerged in Britain and the United States during the mid- to late-1950s. The movement presented a hallenge to traditions of fine art by cluding imagery from popular and mass culture, such as advertising, comic books and mundane cultura objects.

## **GRUNGE GRAFFITI**

Grunge emerged during the mid-1980s in the U.S. state of Washington, Seattle. Street art and Graffiti art are part of the modern urban scene that are developed in public spaces, and at times imply the unsanctioned art as opposed to the art

accepted by the establishment.

# **ARTS & CRAFTS**

The Arts and Crafts movement was an international movement in the decorative and fine arts that began in Britain and flourished in Europe and North America between about 1880 and 1920, emerging in Japan in the 1920s.



# **CUBSIM**

Cubism is an early-20th-century art movement which brought European painting and sculpture historically forward toward 20th century Modern art, Cubism in its various forms inspired related movements in literature and architecture.



## **EXPRESSIONSIM**

Expressionism was a modernist movement, initially in poetry and painting, originating in Germany, Its typical trait is to present the world solely from a subjective perspective, distorting it radically for emotional effect in order to evoke moods or ideas.



# **DE STIJL**

De Stijl, Dutch for "The Style", also known as Neoplasticism, was a Dutch artistic movement founded in 1917 in Leiden. De Stijl consisted of artists and architects. In a narrower sense, the term De Stijl is used to refer to a body of work from 1917 to 1931 founded in the Netherlands.



# **BAUHAUS**

Bauhaus literally translated to 'construction house" originated as a German school of the arts in the early 20th century. Founded by Walter Gropius, the school eventually morphed into its own modern art movement characterized by its unique approach to architecture and



# AMERICAN KITSCH

"Kitsch" is a German word meaning "in bad taste." In the arts, kitsch is used to describe art that is pretentious, vulgar and displays a complete lack of sophistication. On the other hand, the idea that something is so bad that it's good is an accurate description of 1950s American Kitsch.


