AO3 Drawing Techniques

Reverse Drawing

Using strong contrast in drawings is a great way to create a dynamic image. Drawing with white material on black paper may require a bit of practice. Most of us are accustomed to drawing with dark material on white paper. This thinking has ingrained in us the impulse to add dark values



and leave the lighter values. When we reverse this thinking by drawing with white material on black paper, the process is the opposite.

This reversal can be challenging, but important in our development as artists.

It forces us to recognise the importance of tints (lighter values) and their relationships with shades (darker values).









