Dear parents,
carers and students

I am delighted that you are considering choosing The Victory Academy for your child's education. Choosing a secondary school is one of the most significant decisions parents and guardians have to make.

The Victory Academy is very proud to be part of the Thinking Schools Academy Trust's (TSAT) family of schools, and our students are taught to use thinking tools to support them with their learning. There are several Academies in the Trust, primarily in Medway, Kent, Plymouth and the Portsmouth areas, including both secondary and primary academies. Our cognitive approach to education provides our students with the tools they need to develop their learning as they grow, facilitating their educational 'Thinking' journey into Sixth Form, to university, and beyond to their chosen career paths.

Our school is named after HMS Victory, first launched in 1765, which was built only 2 miles from here at the Chatham Historic Dockyard. We have strong links with the Navy and are proud to have our very own Sea Cadet unit. The Victory Academy is at the heart of Chatham, and we are proud to be part of, and work with, our local community and enjoy our unique status within Medway as a school focusing on artistic excellence, naval heritage and cognitive education.

At The Victory Academy, we are committed to transforming the life chances of our students, ensuring that all are supported and encouraged to have high aspirations and achieve their personal best. We consider ourselves to be highly inclusive, and welcome students of all backgrounds and beliefs.

A Foundation for Thinking

To be a student at The Victory Academy is to be part of something special.

The Thinking Schools Academy Trust is a family of schools that work together to “transform the life chances” of all our children and young people. We share a common mission to nurture successful young people who are confident and can think and act independently.

As part of the Thinking Schools Academy Trust, The Victory Academy takes pride in the unique approach we take to education; we provide our students with the skills and tools they need to think in a variety of ways and become lifelong learners. We believe that the best way to transform the life chances of our young people and help them achieve their aspirations is by shaping their minds, attitudes and habits through a framework of cognitive education that enables them to become the masters of their own destiny.

Our students are equipped with a bank of Thinking Tools designed to prepare them for a range of scenarios, dilemmas and circumstances that they may face in life as part of modern society.

The use of these Tools in our curriculum is supported by scientific and metacognitive research, and students are encouraged to apply their tools independently and use them to unlock new ideas. Our Thinking Tools include Thinking Maps, De Bono’s Thinking Hats and Art Costa’s Habits of Mind. These tools are used consistently across all areas of our curriculum and support our students tremendously in their learning and personal growth.

The concept of ‘Being your Best Self’ is also at the heart of our approach to learning at The Victory Academy as part of our Thinking School ethos. Children are encouraged to strive to be and achieve their best, and are given multiple opportunities to reflect on their learning and work on their

personal development. We have a bespoke ‘Learning Period 1’ at the start of each day which provides opportunities for reflection and personal development.

In 2022, The Victory Academy was accredited as an Advanced Thinking School by the University of Exeter’s School of Education, which leads the way on Metacognition, Thinking Skills and Creativity.





Advanced Technologies

The Victory Academy has outstanding facilities for students to use to support their learning.

We have four newly refurbished, fully resourced ICT suites that students can access as well as an Open Access computer area in the Art and Design, Technology and Sixth Form areas. In addition, many departments have their own mini-ICT suites with technology specifically to meet the needs of the subject. In addition, every classroom has an electronic whiteboard to enable teachers to use the most interactive and engaging media with their students.

At The Victory Academy, students are able to enhance their learning by harnessing the latest technologies in a creative and exciting manner. In September 2025 we look forward to the opening of our new Sixth Form building further enhancing the learning and support environment for students.
