Unit 1 exam

This exam is worth 120 marks around ¼ of your final grade

The exam paper is released in January you will complete a project relating to the specified title under supervision.

The last week of April you sit the exam which is 3 hours writing a commentary of your project.

You will create a piece of work to be exhibited in our school exhibition Studio VA

Unit 2 -Exam

This is exam is in 2 parts. You receive the first part in March, this is a research project, this is supervised.

In May you sit the second part, you receive a new paper in exam conditions and have 3 hours to respond to the question. You are usually allowed 1 a4 sheet of writing of notes from your research.





What will you coursework look like?

- Your coursework is a mixture of research, drawing and practical experimentation, photography, design development and written reflection and analysis.
- Your coursework will be presented into a sketchbook.
- You will pick 6 or more artists, that relate to the Dreams visions and Nightmares
