Dear Parent/Carer

As we head towards the end of term, please make sure you look out for our end of term newsletter which will update you on the varied and exciting events that have taken place since September. We will send this to all parents and carers at the end of term, and this will also be shared on our website.

End of Term

The last day of this term is Friday 20th December. Students will be dismissed from school at 12.30pm. Please ensure your child has an appropriate arrangement in place to get home safely. Students entitled to a free school meal can collect this from The Galley at breaktime. As a reminder, our expectations for student dress on this day are below.

The last day of this term is a non-uniform day. The theme for the day is 'Christmas'. Students are invited to wear a Christmas jumper or Christmas-themed clothing, if they wish to. We ask for a donation of £1 which will be donated to the Save the Children. On non-uniform days, we **do not** allow:

- strappy or strapless tops
- short skirts or shorts
- baseball caps or woolly hats
- excessive makeup, false nails or jewellery as per our uniform expectations
- offensive slogans
- high-heeled shoes, boots or sliders

On Wednesday 18th December, The Galley will be serving Christmas lunch (orders via PlusPay for this are now closed). Students who have already purchased tickets for Christmas lunch will receive these in Form Time. If your child is not having a Christmas lunch, The Deli in The Galley will be open as usual at break and lunch, or students can purchase food and snacks at The Sub (break and lunch). The Sixth Form Centre food servery will be open at break time only.

Term 3

Students return to school on **Monday 6th January** and should arrive to school, ready to learn at line up or in tutor time by 8.30am. Please support us by ensuring your child is in school by this time in full, correct uniform with their equipment for the day. A reminder that we do not permit piercings other than a small stud in the lower earlobe. Unnatural hair colours, long/false nails and false eyelashes are also not permitted. During this cold period, please encourage your child to wear a warm coat to school (hoodies are not permitted) and suitable underclothing if necessary (such as a thermal layer or a plain, white t-shirt).
