





Communication & Mobile Phones

There will be times when you have questions and concerns you wish to raise, and we want to ensure we work with you to resolve these as quickly and effectively as possible.

There are times in the day when the phone lines can become busier so at these times, you might find it easier to email instead. In addition, I would also like to take this opportunity to remind parents of our approach towards mobile phones.

Mobile phones are not permitted to be seen or heard anywhere on school site. Phones that are seen or heard will be confiscated and can be collected, that day, at 3.15pm from Student Services. We would ask for your support in maintaining these expectations by refraining from contacting your child directly using their mobile phone. If you need to pass a message to your child, please do so through the school office. In turn, students should also not be contacting parents/carers using their mobile phones during the school day. Should students need to make contact home, they should report to Student Services at breaktime or lunchtime so this can be discussed with staff.
